

Town of Triana Regular Council Meeting
Tuesday, December 27, 2022
6:30p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Caudle. The Clerk called the roll, Council members George Ragland, Jason Garstka, Casey Whitman, Levoneia Ayers and Mayor Mary Caudle, all present. Council member Erica Hopkins was absent. Members present constituted a quorum.

Legal counsel Caleb Ballew and the clerk Sharron Humphrey were also present.

Council member Ayers made the motion to approve the minutes dated December 12th. Council member Whitman second the motion. Motion carried.

Council member Whitman made the motion to approve the minutes dated Dec. 16th with corrections. Council member Ayers second the motion. Motion carried.

Mayor Caudle's Report: No Report

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Fire & Police: Chairperson Ragland reported Police Dept. traveled 2,377 miles, made 19 traffic stops, wrote 12 warning citations, 8 traffic citation, 37 calls for service, 3 arrests and 10 reports. Fire Dept responded to 4 outside fires, 2 structured fires, 6 alarms, 25 emergency calls and 3 motor vehicles accidents. Total month to date 40.

Council member Ayers stated during the Special Call meeting Council member Hopkins asked about EMA and heating sources. She stated she spoke with the Fire Chief who stated they do receive EMA notices. They do not attend any EMA meetings but that would be something they could do or someone could be present. They do receive notifications whenever there's a meeting on what is out there. Mayor stated she receives notifications by email she can forward them what she receives.

Mayor Caudle reported as expected Officer Mayfield has turned in his 2 weeks' notice, his last day will be Jan. 8th 2023. He thanked the Police Chief and the Council for his opportunity to work with us. He has been with us right at 2 years.

Mayor Caudle further stated she has heard he will be going to work with the City of Madison, we do wish him well. She stated we now have 1 position open if anyone knows of a person to fit the position to send them our way.

Finance: No Report

Council member Whitman reported that the bid for the 2009 Impala closes on today. The clerk reported we received 1 bid. Mayor stated we should know tomorrow.

Council member Ragland reported on today around 12noon there was a trailer traveling on Zierdt Rd that went straight across 6th Street and made a right turn on 5th Street to the Dollar General Store. He asked was that okay for them to do that or do we need to put up street signs showing the truck route.

Mayor Caudle asked Police Chief Powell with the town having a sign up stating no right turn on 6th Street could they be ticketed. Chief Powell stated yes. Mayor stated ticketing them may make them start using the correct route.

Mayor asked Chief Powell to talk with the companies on 6th Street about the trucks traveling down Zierdt Rd.

Council member Ragland stated the Truck drivers driving in on Zierdt Rd need a solution as to how they will turn around. Mayor Caudle stated we continue to educate them to take Wall Triana Hwy like they're supposed to.

RESOLUTIONS, ORDINANCES, ORDERS AND OTHER BUSINESS:

Council member Whitman made the motion to adopt Resolution 2022-06 regarding Hazard Mitigation Plan. Council member Ayers second the motion. Motion carried.

Mayor reported we bought new furniture, tables.

Council member Whitman stated he received a call from the manager of ADAMS Homes who indicated that the cluster mailbox units they purchased have come in. They're current plan is to put them near the pool. They're waiting to get confirmation from the Post Office before installing them. They plan to have them installed by the new year.

Council member Whitman reported a minor water leak at the tornado shelter. He stated the water has been shut off.

Mayor Caudle stated we need to get the generator looked at she asked the clerk to reach out to City of Madison find out who they use.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Francis Goggins thanked the Mayor and Council for their diligence in getting involved with their problem they've been having with their mail. He stated it's been 9months and 5 days with no mail delivery. Mayor stated the other developers are already installing cluster mail boxes. They all should be installed on his street the 1st week of January.

Chief Powell reported that the Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) ordered in January of has been shipped.
